



## **Eligibility**

### **Players**

- have played varsity baseball in Section V and may have gone on to play college or professional baseball as a result of their experience in Section V
- demonstrated superior competence and professionalism in making contributions to the high school baseball program
- are of worthy citizenship and a positive role model
- have retired from active participation for a period of three(3) years

### **Coaches**

- have served a minimum of ten (10) years as a head coach
- have demonstrated superior competence and professionalism in making contributions to high school baseball
- are of worthy citizenship and a positive role model
- are retired from active coaching for a period of three (3) years

### **Umpires**

- have obtained twenty (20) years of officiating experience
- have demonstrated superior competence and professionalism in making contributions to high school baseball
- are of worthy citizenship and a positive role model
- have retired from active officiating for a period of three (3) years

### **Contributor**

- have contributed to Section V baseball in a variety of ways: volunteer, sponsorship, assistant coach, committee work, etc.
- are of worthy citizenship and a positive role model

### **Nominations:**

Nominations can be obtained from the Hall of Fame web site under Section V Baseball and must be on file by the initial committee meeting to be considered for induction in the summer of that year. Nominations should include a current resume of the nominee's achievements in athletics, the profession, and other related experiences. Candidates nominated for induction remain eligible for ten (10) years. Candidates (living) must be present at the ceremony in order to be inducted into the Section V Baseball Hall of Fame. If a deceased candidate is nominated and inducted we request that a member of the family be in attendance at the induction ceremony.
